

Literacy at Sheffield Springs Academy



At Sheffield Springs Academy, we believe reading is a crucial skill for success in:

- in every subject across the curriculum – no matter what you are learning about, being able to understand or use language is key!
- in exam situations you need to be able to read the question and understand it in order to answer it!
- in later life college, apprenticeships, jobs, universities and beyond: the world has never been more literate!

Literacy is "the ability to read, write and speak fluently."


Accelerated Reader



- Accelerated Reader is a system of focussed reading with monitoring of success
- Students select books based on their ZPD to read independently or aloud to staff.
- During reading, tasks are completed to support and benefit reading.
- Once the book is finished, the students take independent electronic comprehension quiz to test their engagement with the text.

 Each book read is worth a certain number of points based on its length and reading level; their success with the comprehension quiz decides how many of those points


they receive.





How can you support us?

- Students must have a reading book every day as part of their basic equipment – please check your student has a book
- If your student has a book from the school LRC, please check with them when it is due to be returned or renewed and prompt them to do so
- Students should be reading at home they have a reading log bookmark to track the time they read – please listen to your student read weekly and sign their reading log bookmark
- Talk to your student about the books they are reading and have read – model reading behaviour

Background



- Employers, universities and colleges are often dissatisfied with school leavers' literacy and numeracy
- Around 42% of employers need to organise additional training for young people joining them
- Making GCSEs and A levels more rigorous will prepare students properly for life after school
- This is our opportunity to introduce a curriculum that gives teachers greater freedom and allows us to teach and assess in better ways

What did students think of National Curriculum levels?



- Students memorised their levels but didn't understand what it is they need to do to improve
- Students were frustrated when their levels don't constantly improve
- Some parents and carers struggled to understand levels
- Inconsistency amongst teachers nationally about the meaning of each level

I think it's weird to go from levels to grades in year 10 (Y9)

I like the numbers if they keep getting better but I hate them if they stay the same all the time (Y7)

I don't properly know what they mean but I know what my target level is in every subject (Y7)

Students are placed in a "pathway" based on previous attainment


