

- ⇒ Make your revision active. Don't just read through your notes, you could make flash cards or a mind-map, or use post it notes all over your bedroom
- ⇒ Find a friend to revise with, test each other or make quizzes to help each other to recall facts
- ⇒ Complete as many past papers as you can, this will get you into the right mindset as you go into the exams
- ⇒ Take regular breaks throughout your revision, eat healthily and drink lots of water
